Goldilocks and the Three Bears.


It has been lovely to share this traditional tale with the children and to repeat it throughout the week. Lots of the children already know the story well and could retell the tale using pictures as prompts. Traditional tales are great for helping children understand story structure and concepts such as character and setting. You might like to reread Goldilocks at home and unpick things a little further by asking questions such as: Why was she called Goldilocks? Why did the bears go for a walk? Why did Goldilocks jump out of bed when she saw the bears?

Spring Term Phonics.

This term in phonics we have been tuning into sounds in words and listening out for how many syllables there are in words. We have also explored what compound words are and enjoyed matching up 2 words to make a new word like star & fish= Starfish.

We have enjoyed practising rhythm and rhyme and enjoyed identifying rhyming words in stories and games. We have also enjoyed learning a new game called Kim's game which has helped us develop our working memory, our observation skills and helped us learn new vocabulary.
