# <u>STEM week</u>

We have celebrated all things STEM in school this week. We looked at a different scientist every day who has had an impact on the world, perhaps ask your child which scientist inspired them the most! We had a visit from Meryl who works for the Ministry of Eco Education and she asked us the big question in Y3...is the weather changing? We also had a visit from 'Oases' who are a company committed to improving the world's Carbon footprint. We looked at how we could improve our carbon footprint at Southridge. It has been an incredibly busy but informative week!

In maths lessons we have been learning all about measurements. We looked at how we could measure objects depending on how big or small they are. Would it be more suitable to use mm, cm or m? We also looked at how to measure the capacity and mass of different containers. As always, the children approached this with enthusiasm and made excellent progress as a result.

#### <u>Science</u>

In science we have started to learn all about animals including humans. This is always a topic that the children find exciting and it fits in well with our upcoming visit to the Hancock museum on Monday 31st March.

#### <u>History</u>

In history lessons we have begun to learn all about the Bronze Age. From experience we know that this is a topic which the children love. We can feel a homework project coming on...! In our English lessons we have started to look at warning tales. We studied pre existing warning tales such as 'Little Red Riding Hood' and 'Alexander's outing' before beginning to

look at 'Kassim and the Greedy Dragon'. The children will be writing their own warning tale in the coming weeks.
