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School's Aims & Priorities

As outlined in the October newsletter, each year we have a number of development priorities that we focus on within school.

To this end, staff across school have been actively incorporating outdoor learning opportunities across the curriculum. These lessons are designed to deliver the objectives of our core and foundation subject plans while adapting the teaching to make full use of our lovely grounds. We have invested in a range of tools and teaching aids specifically designed to support and facilitate outdoor learning and the feedback from pupils is that they are thoroughly enjoying these enriched learning opportunities.

Children from Reception to Year 4 have been focusing on the learning of key number facts, including the speedy recall of multiplication facts for those children in Year 2-4. While younger children are using rekenreks as a means to develop addition and subtraction fluency, the older children are loving Times Tables Rockstars as a digital method of practising multiplication and division facts. This forms a clearly designed learning pathway to help children to achieve real fluency by the time they leave us at the end of Year 4.

We have continued our with work Oracy 21, to help our pupils develop effective speaking and listening skills. Staff are seeing a marked improvement in children's ability to manage more sophisticated conversations and to use a variety of sentence stems to structure their thoughts when they are discussing topics.

As we endeavour to make Southridge First School an environment where everyone recognises the positive impact we can have on ourselves, others, our local community and the wider world, we are looking forward to our first Social Ambassador visits next term. Their aim is to identify ways in which their work or leisure activities positively impact a particular part of their community and world. They will be sharing some of their experiences with the children, setting them some challenges to achieve, and looking forward to hearing back from us later in the year to find out what we have achieved. Our ambassadors cover areas such as: The Environment; Our Local Community; Physical Wellbeing; and 'Equity and Inclusion' with more in the pipeline. Hopefully their **positive impact** will become apparent as the year progresses!

Healthy Eating



As anyone who is familiar with the work of Dr Chris van Tulleken (Cbeebies' Operation Ouch; author of 'Ultr-processed People) knows, the food we feed our children (and ourselves) has an impact on development, concentration and behaviour. To support our children with this, we have been working with Mellors, who supply our school dinners, to try and monitor the amount and quality of processed food that is served from the school kitchen. They are very keen to work with school to 'make' rather than 'buy-in' as much food as possible - maybe this is why Claire, our cook's, homemade pizza is so popular!

Can we please ask that those parents whose children bring a packed lunch to school also try to ensure that it is balanced and limits high-sugar, ultra-processed foods. There is a very helpful 'app' that can be installed on smart phones called 'Yuka' that allows you to scan the barcode of almost any bought foodstuff from the supermarket and gives you an instant idea as to whether it is a positive or addition to a child's packed lunch. School Comms



We will be leaving 'Teachers to Parents' after the half term holiday. After this point, we will only be using School Gateway as our communication method. School Gateway allows us to send short messages via their app (which you have been brilliant at installing on your devices - thank you) and also sends emails to your email address that is registered with school.

This means that when we have messages to share they will appear as alerts on your phone in the School Gateway app, and longer information will arrive via email.

Playtime Activities

During the winter months while the school playing field is unavailable at playtimes, the children make great use of the MUGA, yard, Butterfly Path, Garden and climbing frames. To safely manage their use, each year group has dedicated timetabled time in the MUGA and Climbing Frame areas. There are activities such as basketball and skipping on the yard, while the MUGA offers a safe space for the children to play football on their day. We do not allow the children to play football on the playground because while many of them are excellent at kicking the ball with real power, they have not yet developed the accuracy that prevents accidents occurring when our younger children get too close or a shot goes astray.

Volunteers Needed

We are looking forward to working with the local volunteering group Hope for Hedges who will be joining us on Monday 17th March (1-3pm) to help plant more hedging around the school boundary. If anyone is available to help, we would love to hear from you. Last year's event was a lovely combination of school and local community working together on a common aim.

We are also in the process of designing a nature pond to be installed in the Outdoor Learning Area, opposite the Year 1 classrooms. This will require some strong arms and backs to help dig out. We do not, as yet, have a date, but if you would be a willing volunteer to help (assuming no diary conflicts), then please let us know.
