Drawing inspiration from these cherished locations, we have spent time honing their artistic skills—carefully sketching pencil outlines before using watercolours to bring their creations to life. Their artwork beautifully captures the essence of Whitley Bay through their own creative interpretations.



The children spent time exploring our forest area in search of minibeasts, working in pairs to investigate hidden creatures under logs, leaves, and plants. Equipped with magnifying glasses, they carefully observed details—watching movement, identifying body parts, and noticing fascinating patterns.



We encouraged their curiosity with thought-provoking questions: "What do you notice? How does this minibeast move?" Their responses were fantastic, full of insightful comparisons like, "This one has six legs, but this one has more!"

The depth of their knowledge and the rich vocabulary they brought to discussions were truly impressive—a testament to their growing observational skills and enthusiasm for the natural world.

Supporting Reading Over the Holidays

Encouraging children to engage with reading over the holidays can make a big difference in their confidence and enjoyment. A few simple activities can help keep their phonics skills sharp:

- Read together and discuss Invite your child to read back their sentences from their phonics book and talk about what they've read. This helps reinforce understanding and build fluency.
- Bedtime stories with a twist Share a bedtime story and encourage your child to spot phonetically decodable words or hunt for tricky words within the text.
- Word spotting on the go Look out for words, digraphs, and tricky words while out and about, turning everyday moments into fun literacy opportunities.
