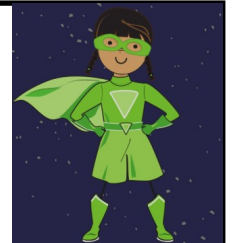


Transition

We are working with the children to identify any questions or worries they have and finding answers and strategies together to help them. Curriculum

We have begun our final unit of French for this year 'Les super-héros'. We have been practicing our numbers, learning colours and also some action words to describe what they superheroes can do.



As part of our science we are continuing to look after our growing vegetables. We have now harvested the mange tout several times and use it as part of our snack alongside the fruit and vegetables provided by the kitchen.

This week we also learned about the diets of different animals and learned some new vocabulary—carnivore, herbivore and omnivore. We also became scatologists, studying some mystery animal scat to find out what the animal had been eating to help us decide what type of animal it might have been. This was also an excellent opportunity to practice our oracy skills and 'talk like a scientist' using sentence starters like:

I think ... belongs... because...
I agree that... because I know...
I disagree with ... because I know...
I know that... but I am not sure if...

The children really embraced this new skill and it was wonderful to hear them offering their explanations, agreeing and disagreeing with each other and backing it up with evidence—how grown up!
