As we share our final Reception newsletter, we want to say the biggest thank you. Your support, kindness and positivity have meant so much throughout the year.




We know they'll continue to shine in Year 1, ready for new adventures and challenges.

We've had a lovely week at school, making the most of the sunshine and taking our learning outdoors whenever possible. With the excitement of the summer holidays beginning to build, we've continued to follow our familiar routines—alongside gentle 'mindful moments'—to help everyone stay calm, focused, and emotionally balanced.

How long could their pieces of ribbon be? Is there more than one answer? This week, we've also been wearing our history hats as we explored life in the 1940s through the beautiful book *Peepo!*, written by Janet and Allan Ahlberg. The children were captivated by the illustrations and loved spotting the differences between life then and now—especially when comparing their own homes and everyday objects they see today.

This week in maths, we've been revisiting measures—focusing on length and height. The children have enjoyed comparing and ordering objects, using language like *longer*, *shorter*, *taller*, and *smaller*. We've been encouraging them to think deeply by asking questions such as: "If I put two of these short objects together, will it still be short?", "Will it now be long? How do you know?".

These kinds of questions help children develop reasoning skills and build confidence in using mathematical vocabulary to explain their thinking.
