Welcome to Year 1

We have had a lovely two weeks of settling in and finding our feet. The children have all done really well getting to know their new routines and we are really impressed with how well they have settled in.

To keep you informed about what is happening in Year 1 and what the children are learning, we will send out a class newsletter fortnightly. Please also check our whole school newsletters as they contain important dates and information.

Year 1 Staff Team

The class teachers Mrs Pringle and Miss Cassidy are supported in class by our KS1 teaching assistants Mrs Hetherington, Mrs Baines and Miss Hopper, who work closely with the children in both classes. In addition, weekly PPA cover is provided by Mrs King in both classes.



PE and Lunches

Part of participating in PE is being able to get changed independently. While this can be a bit of a challenge, we can see how hard the children are trying and, as this is the first time they have got changed all at the same time, they are already doing amazingly well! It would help them to keep practising this important skill at home, particularly buttons and socks. Children who are already wearing socks to school do not need to change them for PE, we just ask that if your child is wearing tights, they keep a pair of socks in their PE bag to change into if needed. Our PE days are Mondays and Fridays. Thank you for your help and support.

The children have been incredible at lunchtime, going up to the hatch to choose their own lunch and carefully carrying their tray to the table. The children tell us in the morning what they would like for lunch and it is always helpful if the children have already had this discussion at home. We also regularly remind the children about the importance of saying please and thank you, as well as using their cutlery correctly.

Spelling

Each half term the children will have a set of 'tricky' words to focus on. The aim is that by the end of the half term, the children can read and spell these words confidently. The words for autumn 1 are : is, his, has, my, by, of. In addition we focus on one spelling pattern each week, linked to phonics. Our focus for week 3 will be words ending in ff, ll, ss, zz and ck. Our focus for week 4 will be words with the /k/ sound spelled k or nk. The children will practise these words in school throughout the week through a range of activities. There is no longer a weekly spelling 'quiz' in school but a set of words will be available each week on Edshed, an online spelling program. The children can access these words at home to give them some additional practise of the focus sound. Their log in details have been attached to their reading record, and we will send some information to support your use of this program at home. We will be showing the children how to use this in school, but if you have any difficulty with this please let us know and we will endeavour to help you.



Important Messages

- Please can we ask you to check all your child's clothes and their water bottle to ensure they are named. It makes it very difficult to return things to the correct children otherwise.
- Small keyrings on bookbags are useful to help the children identify their own bag. However, large or multiple keyrings can make it difficult to fit all of the bookbags in the boxes. Please can we ask that large keyrings are removed. We appreciate your support with this.
- Please can we ask all children to bring a pair of named wellies to leave at school to support our outdoor learning opportunities if they have not already done so. If you do not have a spare pair of wellies please let us know as we have a number of donated pairs available.
- We appreciate that it is not always easy to talk to staff at the beginning or end of the day. If you would like to talk to your child's teacher you can send us an email and we will get back to you as soon as we can either by email or phone. Please be aware that emails are not always picked up during the school day. If you do need to talk to your child's teacher at pick up time, please wait until all the children have been collected so that this can be done as quickly as possible. We appreciate your patience at pick up time as we get to know all our new families.
- If your child is due to be collected by someone different, you must inform the class teacher. This is best done either at drop off time or by contacting the school office if it is a last minute change, who will pass the message to us.
- While children often want to bring toys in from home, this can cause great upset if things get lost or broken. We would appreciate your support in ensuring that children do not bring their own toys into school.

Reading

We are currently completing our reading assessments to determine the most appropriate reading level for your child. In school, every child reads at least once a week as part of a group. To ensure the children are reading in a group of similar ability, in Year 1 we group the children across the 2 classes which means your child will read with children from both classes and both class teachers during the year. We really value your support with reading at home and ask that you aim to read little and often, 5-10 minutes daily is ideal. Please record this in your child's reading record booklet by circling the days they have read in the 'home' section and you can also record a comment if you wish. The children will change their reading books once a week and take home 2 books at a time. We ask that, initially, you spend time focusing on the red and green words, playing games with them to build your child's confidence. Once you begin reading the story, encourage your child to read these red and green words on sight where possible, which will help to build fluency. Re-reading the same books several times during the week is also hugely valuable to children when building pace and understanding. This week each child has taken home their next book based on what they were reading at the end of Reception. Once our assessments are complete we will regroup the children and they will bring home their new book on their reading day.
