OUTDOOR CLASSROOM

We have been really enjoyed taking our learning outdoors recently! In English we went to explore the school grounds looking for nouns. We then worked together to create expanded noun phrases by choosing adjectives to make our writing more interesting for the reader.



In Geography, to develop our understanding of maps and the features of our local area, we walked around the school grounds to create our own sketch maps of Southridge!

We then learnt about metres and worked together to estimate and then measure the length of one metre. We then compared and measured natural materials using the <, > and = symbols.



We will continue with our outdoor learning as the weather turns colder and wetter. Having a pair of wellies in school will allow the children to access all areas of the school grounds.
