Welcome to the Year 3 newsletter. We have had a busy few weeks bursting with learning and fun - from the Stone Age, handball, harvest and so much more! Already we have seen some amazing homework projects - the children have been so enthusiastic about this topic, we can really see this in their work. We look forward to seeing what else is to come!

History

In our history lessons, we have continued to learn about the Stone Age. This week, we started to look at how the people of the Stone Age changed their thinking over time. They went from hunter gatherers to becoming much more sustainable growing their own crops and keeping livestock.

In our lessons, we looked at the 3 main periods: the Palaeolithic Period (Old Stone Age), the Mesolithic Period (Middle Stone Age), and the Neolithic Period (New Stone Age). This really sparked the children's interest and they

enjoyed comparing each period seeing how they developed over time.

Maths

This week, we have started to learn about perimeter. Perimeter is the distance around a shape and we have measured the perimeter of various 2D shapes. Some great discussions about real life jobs and careers when perimeter would be useful! Taking our learning outside, we measured the perimeter of the MUGA with a trundle wheel which was great fun!

Science

We are still learning about rocks and this week we carried out an exciting experiment. We did lots of testing using water, vinegar and sand paper to see which rocks were the hardest, softest and most permeable.
