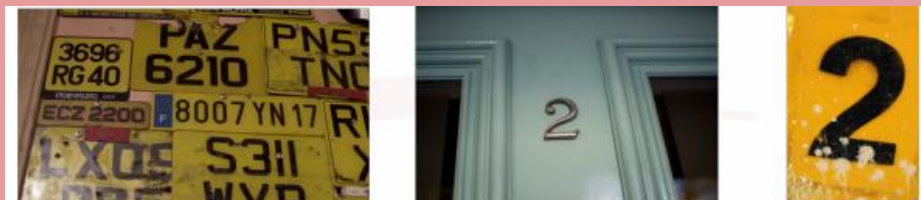

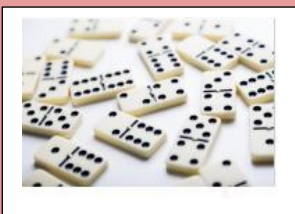

Home Top Tips For Developing Mathematical Awareness.

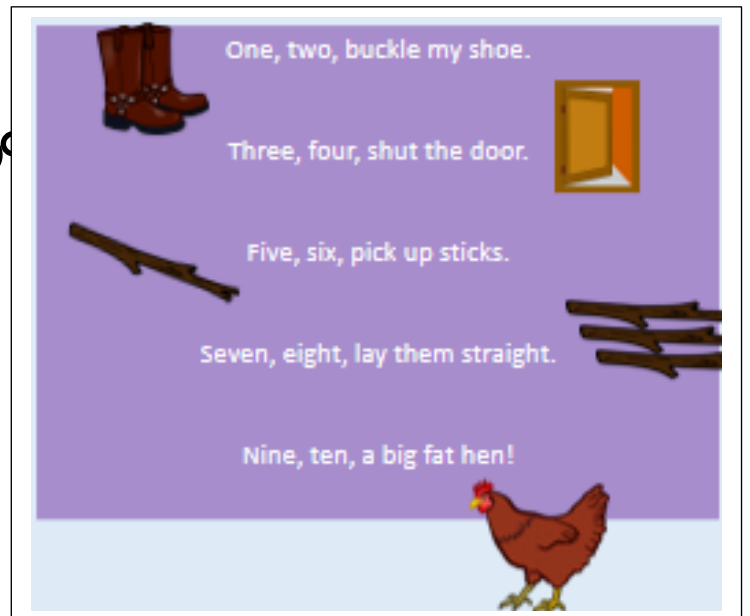
- Spot the number 2 on walks, car number plates or door numbers
