Our newsletter is sent out fortnightly to keep you up to date.


Friday 14th November

Maths

In Maths, the children have finished their work on 2D shapes in Geometry. They showed a great understanding of quadrilat-

erals and their specific properties. To consolidate your learning try these activities by clicking on the image.



We have now moved on to multiplication, focusing on building fluency, which will support the children when applying these skills to written methods. To continue practising at home, you can use the **Top Marks Hit the Button** game to help strengthen



recall of the 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 8 times tables by clicking on the image.

In our new Geography topic, the children have begun learning about the USA. In their first lesson, they explored a range of images and worked together to categorise them into sections such as *rural* and *urban*. This helped them understand the

variety of landscapes and environments found across the country. Following this, the children used atlases to locate different areas and identify key geographical features, including mountain ranges, rivers, and

oceans. They showed



great curiosity and teamwork as they discovered just how diverse the United States really is!

English

In English, the children have been learning how to write non-chronological reports with a focus on ancient civilisations. They have explored how to use subordinating conjunctions to add detail and explanation, as well as how to write clear topic sentences to introduce each paragraph. The children have also been developing their use of precise nouns and practising writing in the present perfect tense to make their reports more informative and engaging. Their next step will be to apply all these skills in their own non-chronological report about an ancient civilisation. If you would like to gain a deeper understanding of these fascinating civilisations, such as the Stone Age to Iron Age and the Ancient Egyptians, you might enjoy doing some research at home. You could explore books, documentaries, or trusted websites to discover more about how people lived, worked, and built their societies. It's a great way to build on what we're learning in class and to share interesting facts with others!
