In the afternoon the children will enjoy some dancing, play party games and then have their party food. Children should come to school dressed in their party clothes and with a small, named plate of food for them to enjoy in the afternoon (no nuts please).

Curriculum

The children have been working incredibly hard on their writing over the last two weeks. First of all we learned 'The Tale of Pirate Tom', using actions to help us remember different parts of the story. We have completed lots of different activities that focus on helping us to develop a better understanding of what a sentence is and how to show the beginning and end of a sentence. We then showed off these skills when writing 'The Tale of Pirate Tom' from memory, using the text map to help us. The children should be very proud of all their hard work and the incredible progress they have made since September.



In mathematics we have been developing our knowledge and understanding of money. We focused on coins and discussed the differences in colour, shape and value. We ordered the coins from the least valuable to the most valuable and then applied our skills to a game. In today's world, children have far less experience of handling money than they used to, so it would be really helpful if they could have access to a range of coins at home to help develop their confidence. If you would like to develop your child's skills further over the Christmas break, you could set up a Christmas shop at home, labelling some toys with price tags and encouraging your child to buy them using real coins. Start with a few toys priced

below 10p and increase the value as they become more confident. Then challenge them to buy more than one item.

Over the last few weeks in art, we have worked on the skill of sketching, drawing both a pirate and a pirate ship. We have also explored watercolour techniques such as wet on wet, wet on dry, gradient and wax resist. We are excited to put all of our new skills into practice to create our final pirate picture and we cannot wait for you to see what the children produce!

Reading

We are really pleased with the progress the children are making with their reading, it is clear that there is a lot of hard work going on at home and it really is making a difference. When we return after the Christmas break, we will begin the process of reassessing the children. As you can imagine, it takes a little while to assess each child but we will let you know when this process has been completed. Children will not necessarily move levels at each assessment point and this is completely normal. If you have any questions about your child's reading please speak to your child's teacher.

After the holidays, we would like to challenge every child in Year 1 to read to an adult at home at least 3 times every week. We hope this will really motivate the children to read more as we know the impact that additional reading at home has. In return, the children will receive a golden ticket for each week that they achieve this. The ticket will go into a weekly draw with a chance to become a 'Boss of the Week'. The more tickets you have as the weeks go on — the more chances you

have to win! In order to complete the challenge an adult <u>must</u> circle the days that they have read and initial their reading record. Happy reading and good luck everyone!
