Using a fun, hands-on activity with a character and a see-through cup, they explored as many different prepositions as they could - finding clever ways to describe where things were and how they moved. With their new grammar skills, they painted vivid pictures in their writing, describing crackling campfires, smoky air, and the flickering glow dancing across the cave walls. Maths

In maths, the children have been learning about pictograms and bar charts, developing their understanding of how to collect, organise, and represent data. As part of their learning, they took their lessons outdoors and collected real data by observing and recording the colours of cars passing by. Using chalk in the school yard, they worked together to create large-scale pictograms, experimenting with different symbols and key amounts to represent their findings. This hands-on, practical approach helped them to visualise data in a meaningful way, while also making learning fun and engaging. The activity encouraged teamwork, problem-solving, and a deeper understanding of how data can be represented and interpreted in everyday life.
