English

In our English lessons, the children have written portal stories which have really wowed us! Using a special object such as a shiny shell, we wrote about a child who travels back in time to the Stone Age period. We have worked really hard to include speech punctuation as well as various other features to make our writing exciting and engaging!

Science

In our science lessons we have been learning all about light. In our first lesson we look at light sources and compared natural and artificial light. Can you quiz the children ask them to share their knowledge on natural and artificial sources of light? We used torches to see which items were opaque, translucent and transparent and then investigated reflection and factors that make objects reflect light.
