Recently, there have been incidents where **wheelchair users were unable to access dropped kerbs** and an **elderly resident could not safely drive past the front of school due to cars parked on double yellow lines**.

Parking on restricted areas not only causes inconvenience but also poses serious safety risks for pedestrians, drivers and our children. Please help us keep our school community safe by following parking guidelines and avoiding double yellow lines and dropped kerbs.

Help and Advice on Managing Children's Digital Lives

The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has published a powerful new guide titled *“What I Wish My Parents or Carers Knew...: A guide for parents on managing children’s digital lives.”* It draws on the voices of children themselves, offering valuable insights into how parents can support their children in today's increasingly digital world.

Why this guide matters

- **Bridging the generational gap:** Young people explained that parents often don't understand the online platforms they use—and advised: “*Be firm, be kind, and trust your instincts*”.
- **Communication matters most:** As young people grow into teenagers they want people they can talk to—not just rules. Dame Rachel stresses the importance of early, open conversations: “*Talk early and talk often*”.
- **Safe, sensible boundaries:** Children asked for clear rules around screen time, apps, and bedtime phone use. When these are explained and set together, they're much more likely to be followed.

Year 3 Waste Warriors Lead the Way!

In the first week of term, they carefully weighed all of our school's food waste, analysed the results, and collaborated with peers, teachers, and the kitchen team to create an action plan.

This week, the Waste Warriors presented an inspiring assembly to the rest of the school, while Georgie led engaging workshops with children right across the school.

Now, all pupils across the school will be working on the actions suggested by the Waste Warriors. Georgie will return in the last week before the half-term holiday to repeat the food waste collection and weighing—so we can see how much we've improved!

Together, we're making a real difference to reduce waste and protect our planet.

Their actions include great ideas like:

- making sure any fruit snack unused by younger years, is shared with the older children.
- offering seconds from the hatch for the older children at the end of service.
- reward stickers for children being brave and trying new foods

- and much more!

Young Carers

Supporting Young Carers in Our School Community

At Southridge First School, we are committed to making sure every child gets the support they need to thrive. We know that sometimes life outside of school can have a big impact—especially if a child has a family member or friend who is ill, disabled, struggling with mental health, or living with an addiction.

In these situations, a child may become a **young carer**, taking on extra responsibilities at home or coping with worries that can be hard to manage. Young carers help in many ways, such as:

- **Practical tasks:** Cooking, washing up, or helping a parent with a physical illness like ME.

- **Personal care:** Assisting a parent with a disability with dressing, bathing, or changing dressings.
- **Emotional support:** Supporting an autistic sibling or a parent experiencing depression.

The Role of the Parent Governor

Parent governors are elected by other parents at the school. If there are more applicants than vacancies then an election will take place on the date specified by the school.

Any parent or carer of a registered pupil in statutory education at the school at the time of election is eligible to stand as a parent governor. They are elected to the governing board by the parents or carers of pupils at the school. Each parent with at least one child at the school shall be eligible to vote. Proxy voting is not permitted. Responsibility for counting the votes lies with the Headteacher and a secret ballot will be conducted. Parent governors do not have to stand down if their child leaves the school but may do so if they wish. As with other governor positions a Parent governor can be suspended or removed by the Governing Board if their behaviour is a cause for concern. The term of office is set out in the School's Instrument of Government.

Parent governors play a vital role on Governing Boards, holding the unique position of having a parental viewpoint of the school. Through their children, they have a first-hand experience of the delivery of the curriculum and how the school is perceived by parents and the local community.

It is important for parent governors to maintain a strategic approach to school governance whilst establishing a rapport with the parental body. This can be a delicate role and a parent governor has to be particularly careful regarding issues of confidentiality. Although being available to advise parents on appropriate routes of action is important, it is essential that parent governors do not become personally involved in individual concerns. This could jeopardise the Complaints and Appeals procedures and no governor has the authority to act individually on behalf of the Governing Board. Parent governors have to be sensitive to when they are acting as a Parent and when they are acting as a governor and be able to act upon concerns as a parent without compromising their role as a governor.

Parent governors are:

- Able to work in partnership with the Headteacher, Senior Leadership team and other governors to raise standards and improve outcomes for all children.
- Expected to act in accordance with the Code of Conduct and be aware of conflicts of interest.
- Representative parents and not a representative for parents.
- Able to guide parents regarding appropriate lines of action and procedures.
- Well placed to present a balanced view of issues.
- Equal in status to all other governors.

Parent governors are not:

- Expected to gather the views of other parents and take them to the Governing Board.
- Simply expected to represent the interests of parents.
- Expected to vote as instructed by other parents
- A link between parents and the Governing Board.
- Able to take up individual complaints.

Savings for your family
You could save over £427 per year for every child that qualifies for free school meals.

Every child over the age of five is entitled to milk at a subsidised cost of around £20 per term. Register your child and pay online.

Children in receipt of benefits-based free school meals are eligible for free school milk. Speak to the school for further information.

Free milk for under 5s is funded by the Department of Health and milk for over 5s is subsidised by DEFRA.
