Book Look

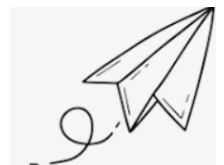

Curriculum

Continuing with our theme of great explorers in history, we have learned about Amy Johnson, who was the first woman to fly solo from England to Australia. We found out about the challenges she faced because of her gender and the belief in gender roles at the time. We were very impressed that she never gave up on her dreams, no matter what other people thought or said.

Our science this half term links to the explorers we are learning about in history. This week, inspired by Amy Johnson, we made our own paper aeroplanes of different sizes and explored whether the size of the aeroplane made a difference to how far it can fly. We tested all our planes and looked for patterns in our results.



In maths, we have explored balances to deepen our understanding when measuring the mass of an object. We carried out lots of practical investigations before doing some problem solving and reasoning activities to show how well we understood. We have also been exploring money and learning how to make a given amount. We set up a shop in our classroom to practise paying with different coins, and then challenged ourselves to find different ways of making the same amount.

In art we applied our shading skills to a drawing of an astronaut, the final results really were fabulous. We then followed a step by step guide to draw our own astronaut. They were all different and all brilliant! They will be added to our finished space pictures next week. Look out for them in our floor books when you come to the book look.

Socks
