This week in P.E., the children have been busy developing and extending their ball and beanbag skills. They have been practising **handling, guiding, and throwing with increasing control and coordination**. It has been wonderful to see their confidence grow as they explore different ways of moving and managing equipment.

In music this week, we have been helping the children to discover and develop their singing voices. Through joyful renditions of *Old MacDonald Had a Farm*, the children have been practising **copying and pitch-matching**, allowing them to explore how to control their voices and sing confidently. It has been lovely to hear their enthusiasm as they join in and experiment with different sounds.

The children have also been developing their listening skills. They are becoming much more confident at identifying whether the music they hear is **fast or slow**, and they are using their bodies to respond to the tempo. We have enjoyed watching them match their movements to the sounds — taking **giant steps** for strong, heavy beats and **tiptoeing** lightly when the music becomes softer or slower.
