Who Helps Keep You Safe?

- All the adults at school (like your teachers and dinner staff) are here to **look after you**.
- Some special adults have jobs just for keeping children safe:
 - **Mr Willcock, Mrs Statham, Miss Parker and Ms Benford** are our **Safeguarding Leads** – that means they help to make sure everyone is safe.
 - You can also talk to **your teacher or any other adult in school** if you're worried.



What If I'm Worried?

If something is making you feel **sad, scared, hurt or unsure**, you can:

- Talk to a **grown-up you trust** at school.
- Tell a teacher, dinner lady, teaching assistant, or any adult in school.
- Use the **Worry Monster** in your classroom.

No worry is too small. We are always here to help.



What Might Make Someone Feel Unsafe?

Sometimes children feel unsafe because of:

- Someone is being **unkind** or **hurting** them
- **Bullying** or being left out
- Hearing or seeing things at home or online that are scary or upsetting
- Being asked to keep a **secret** that makes them feel uncomfortable



Everyone Has the Right to Feel Safe

Every child has the right to:

- Be **safe and protected**
- Be **listened to**
- Get **help** when they need it



Staying Safe Online

When you're using the computer or tablet:

- Only visit websites your **teacher or parent say are okay**
- Don't talk to people you don't know
- If something online makes you feel worried – **tell an adult straight away**



Remember:

- If you're ever unsure, **speak up**.
- We **won't be cross** – we'll be proud you told someone.
- Our job is to **help and protect you**.
