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| <b>Overview:</b><br>Hello everyone, in addition to the activities listed below, please continue to read daily to an adult and record this in your reading diary,  |
| <b>Maths:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Find pairs of numbers that sum to 10 by following <a href="#">this link</a>.</li><li>2. Set up a game using 4 boxes/baskets and number them 1 - 4. Find 2 soft toys and throw them into the boxes. Add the two numbers together and record your score as a number sentence. Challenge: use 3 soft toys. Further challenge: change the numbers.</li><li>3. Practise writing digits 0 - 9 correctly.</li></ol>   |
| <b>English:</b> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Follow <a href="#">this link</a> and join in to learn about punctuating your sentences with capital letters and full stops.</li><li>2. Try one of the activities on creating and describing characters from <a href="#">this page</a>.</li><li>3. Handwriting: Follow <a href="#">this link</a> and use any paper you may have at home to practise your letter formation.</li><li>4. Log on to <a href="#">EdShed</a> and practise spelling the words of the week.</li></ol>   |
| <b>Science:</b> <p>If I make and use a square bubble wand, will I produce a square bubble? Find a way to test this.</p> <p>Bubble mixture<br/>Makes 350ml<br/>Prep 5 minutes<br/>50ml washing-up liquid (one part)<br/>300ml water (six parts)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Measure the washing-up liquid into a container, such as a jam jar or glass bottle.</li><li>2. Slowly add in the water, being careful not to create too many bubbles at this stage. Gently stir the mixture together to combine - a chopstick is perfect for this.</li><li>3. If you can, let the bubble mixture rest before using it, as it will make your bubbles even better.</li><li>4. When you're ready, dip your bubble wand into the mixture and start blowing bubbles!</li></ol> <p>Maybe you have a question of your own you would like to find the answer to.</p> |
