Overview:	
Hello everyone, in addition to the activities listed below, please continue to read daily to an adult and record this in your reading diary,	
Maths:	
1.	Find pairs of numbers that sum to 10 by following <u>this link</u> .
2.	Set up a game using 4 boxes/baskets and number them 1 - 4. Find 2 soft toys and throw them into the boxes. Add the two numbers together and record your score as a number sentence. Challenge: use 3 soft toys. Further challenge: change the numbers.
3.	Practise writing digits 0 - 9 correctly.
English:	
1.	Follow <u>this link</u> and join in to learn about punctuating your sentences with capital letters and full stops.
2.	Try one of the activities on creating and describing charcaters from <u>this page.</u>
3.	Handwriting: Follow <u>this link</u> and use any paper you may have at home to practise your letter formation.
4.	Log on to <u>EdShed</u> and practise spelling the words of the week.
Science:	
If I make and use a square bubble wand, will I produce a square bubble? Find a way to test this.	
Bubble mixture	
Makes 350ml	
Prep 5 minutes	
50ml washing-up liquid (one part)	
300ml water (six parts)	
1. Measure the washing-up liquid into a container, such as a jam jar or glass bottle.	
2. Slowly add in the water, being careful not to create too many bubbles at this stage. Gently stir the mixture together to combine - a chopstick is perfect for this.	
3.	If you can, let the bubble mixture rest before using it, as it will make your bubbles even better.
4.	When you're ready, dip your bubble wand into the mixture and start blowing bubbles!
