Stone Age Day - Year 3 enjoyed a visit from Durham University archaeologists and found out about the Stone Age through to the Iron Age. The children became archaeologists, handling and identifying different stone age tools. They also made embossed coins. Our visitors

were very impressed with the depth of their knowledge so early in the term.

Year 2 Lighthouse Visit - the children spent the morning on a mini-beast hunt and





then went rock pooling. They compared the creatures they found and talked about how they adapted to their habitat.

High Borrans meeting for Year 4 parents – come along on Monday 7^{th} October at 5pm and find out about the Year 4 residential visit.

Our school uniform policy states that - Long hair should be tied back. Hair accessories such as slides and bobbles should be simple and if possible in school colours. Headscarves, bandanas and fancy hairbands should not be worn. Jewellery - for health and safety reasons we ask that the children do not wear jewellery in school, including earrings of any kind. Any child wearing earrings will be asked to remove them for PE, and newly pierced ears will need to be covered with tape for the lesson. In line with North Tyneside Local Authority safety guidelines, children are not allowed into the swimming pool wearing earrings.
