Literacy

<u>Non – Fiction</u> – Note taking and discussion- linked to other subject areas (The Victorians). Debate and letter stating point of view.

Information books linked to other curricular areas eg:- Victorians.

<u>Fiction:</u> Middle School transition Unit- Aliens. Design an alien and write an explanation text about how to catch one.

Stories/short novels etc.. which raise issues eg:bullying, bereavement and injustice.

Spelling: collect/classify words with common roots; investigate origins and meanings

<u>Number</u>: Refine written methods for column addition / subtraction, multiplication and division, solve money and real life problems.
