MORNING ROUTINE ON THE PLAYGROUND

THANK YOU to all those parents who encourage their children to line up independently and who have stood back as staff lead their class in.



Please can you either:

Leave as soon as the whistle goes to reduce congestion — the children are used to lining up at break and lunchtime in this way and do so very sensibly.

OR

Stand back and wait at the lining up area and allow your children to follow their teacher on their own, in to school in their class line.

If your child is in Year 1,2, and 4 please do not walk in the line with your child / push prams through the line. The class teachers are finding it very difficult to lead their children in to school when crowds of parents are walking in the line /alongside their children and they have to stop to allow adults past.

Please pass this message on to grandparents /childminders etc. if another adult brings your child to school.



T.J's First Aid course—all of the children in Year 1 took part in a basic First Aid Session this week, covering how to check for dangers, and who to ask for help.

Our Year 4 children also have the opportunity to do 'Little Rescuers' a 6 week First Aid course after school.

Ozobot workshops—over the next few weeks the children will be developing their coding skills with the Ozobots. An Ozobot is a little toy robot that teaches children programming skills ... Ozobot can identify lines, colors, on paper and the children can programme them to follow a route. The PTA's fundraising efforts have enabled us to purchase 2 class packs.

Talk for Writing

This year we are delivering 'Talk for Writing' across the school. One of the initiatives in our School Development Plan is to encourage our children to develop a love of writing and also to reduce the gender gap between boys and girls in writing. We certainly feel that this approach has really engaged all our children this term and they are very proud of the fabulous writing they have produced. We know that you were impressed with the children's writing books at the recent Parent Consultations.

Talk for Writing was developed by the author Pie Corbett. It is a fun, creative and also rigorous approach to develop writers.


Talk for Writing starts with enjoying and sharing stories. Throughout the school, we place a strong emphasis on children reading stories and enjoying a range of literature. Through regular reading, we want children to build up an extensive and rich vocabulary for use in their own writing.





During the initial 'imitation' stage of Talk for Writing, children learn to tell a story off by heart. They retell a text with expression and actions and make use of a story map to support their retelling. Once the story is learnt, children are encouraged to adapt it. At the 'innovation' stage, children make the story their own, for example, by changing the character or setting. Finally, at the 'invention' stage, children write their own text independently.

Please ask your children about their story maps and how they use them in their writing.
