


## Southridge First School Nursery Newsletter 4<sup>th</sup> December 2020

We also read 'Goodnight Spaceman' by Michelle Robinson, inspired by the astronaut Tim Peake and his sons, this is another exciting story about an adventure before bedtime. These stories and the brilliant ideas generated by the children have caused lots of excitement in Nursery.



Popular Activities.

The children have loved the rocket station, making marks in moon dust, the glow in the dark stars and the torches in the dark tent. We have been dressing up in space suits and thinking about what we would take on a trip to the moon, what we might see on the way and what it might be like when


we get there.

## Look Up!

We have all been inspired to look at the sky and notice changes so this week's moon and the double rainbow we spotted on Monday afternoon have been fantastic talking points and have led to some lovely art work and mark making.

In maths this week we have been looking at the number rhyme to help us learn the number 7: across the sky and down from heaven, now I've made a seven.





We have been learning about the phoneme /t/ and the sound it makes in words like tower, toast, tomato and turtle. It is a short, bouncy sound. We use the picture to help us remember this sound and the formation rhyme to help us write it: down the tower and across the tower.

## Christmas Party Day.

On Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> December the children will finish the term with their Christmas Party. They can come to Nursery wearing their party clothes and we ask that each child brings their own small plate of party food with their name on it. Due to a number of allergies we ask that foods containing nuts are not included on children's plates. There will be party games, crafts and dancing!
