School Development Plan Priorities 2018-19 - School self-evaluation is a continuous process in our school. We collect information and evidence about the standards in our school in a number of different ways. These are then analysed, collated and the findings are used to appraise achievements and identify priorities to be pursued to improve the quality of teaching and learning. Southridge First School involves all stakeholders in the school self-evaluation process.

Priorities for this year

All the evidence show that Southridge is an excellent school. The school used evidence from its self-evaluation to identify key steps that will enable the school to maintain our high standards. These are as follows:

- 1. Ensure specific and focussed monitoring takes place which is effective, enabling us to maintain our high standards and school ethos.
- 2. Develop Talk 4 Writing strategy to improve confidence of boys in writing and increase the percentage of boys <u>exceeding</u> year group expectations in writing at the end of Reception, KS1 and Year 4
- 3. ensure that we offer an 'inspirational, broad and balanced' curriculum that meets the needs of Southridge children.
- 4. Improve the resilience and independence of our children and develop the importance of learning from mistakes! Continue to focus on our Core Values.
