Spellings and Topic Web

Today was our last spelling practise for this half term. We will be sending out the next set of spellings next week and these will be added to Edshed too. This is an excellent resource to help your child practise their spellings through different games alongside the more traditional 'look, cover, write, check' paper activity. We will also send you our Summer 1 topic web to give you an insight into what the children will be learning next half term.

Curriculum

In DT we have been learning how to tell the difference between fruit and vegetables. We explored some common foods and grouped them into those we thought were vegetables and those we thought were fruit. We were surprised to learn that all fruit have seeds which included cucumbers, tomatoes and avocadoes! We have also learnt which parts of the plant fruit and vegetables come from.



In computing, we have been learning how to create and debug an algorithm. We created our algorithms using a flow chart to direct a car from one location to another on a map. When we experienced an error, we went back to check which part of the algorithm needed changing.



We were very excited to have a French lesson with Miss Smith who taught us some new games and activities to develop our French vocabulary. We put actions to words and then strung words together to create short sentences. We are excited to practise this more!
