In the afternoon they will also have party games in the hall and lastly a small party tea before home time.

Friday 18th December - Christmas Jumper Day - non-uniform

Christmas Crafts morning - our PTA have very kindly funded some Christmas craft resources enabling each class to have a craft morning next week. This is a lovely activity in the final week and we send our thanks on behalf of the children and staff.



Last day of school will still be Friday December 18th at Southridge - I am sure that you have seen in the news the education minister stating that schools can finish a day early on December 17th to help with track and trace timescales. As a school, we always plan our teacher training days well in advance and you will be aware that as we have had one at the start of this term and have one planned for January 4th, and 28th May we do not have any other training days that can be rescheduled. I also take into consideration that to only give parents just over a week's notice to try and arrange childcare in the current climate would put great stress and anxiety onto our school community. ## CONTACT TRACING -

End of term 18<sup>th</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup> December - YOU MUST CONTACT SCHOOL by emailing the school email account office@southridgefirst.org.uk. if your child has a positive Covid test following symptoms that developed over the weekend of 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> December.

The email will be checked daily at midday and school would then liaise with Public Health England and the appropriate action taken if required.

You DO NOT need to contact school if symptoms develop from Monday 21<sup>st</sup> December as this is over 48hours since your child had contact with the other children in their class bubble.

Reminder - Children return to school on Tuesday 5th January 2021.
