Reception Newsletter 4.12.20

The Christmas Day countdown began on Tuesday and there is a real festive buzz beginning to stir in Reception. We have enjoyed hearing the funny tales about what the elves have been up to or what the children have found behind the advent calendar door each day. In class we have talked what Advent means and we have each made a Christingle to take home.

During circle time this week we have also talked about 'Respect', one of our school Core Values, and the importance of looking after our belongings. We have looked at pictures of toys from the past and agreed that we need to try our best to look after our toys to keep them feeling special.

In PE, we have discussed the importance of warming up before we exercise and why we need to keep fit. The children have been perfecting their balancing skills and practised throwing and catching an air ball. Outside we have been digging in the sand and building more assault courses with tyres and wood. We are really building our fine motor and gross motor skills!



In phonics, we are exploring 'real' and 'nonsense' words, sounding them out and trying to put them in to a sentence to see if they make sense. You could practise this game at home

<u>x0</u> You may wish to play a 'tricky word hunt' at home or maybe write the tricky words as an additional challenge. We have enclosed a copy of the Read, Write Inc letter formation sheet in book bags to remind the children of the stories for each different letter's formation.

In math, we have been learning the 7 days of the week and remembering the order. We have also asked questions about the week such as 'what day is it today?' 'What day is it tomorrow?' and used the class number line to count 'how many days until Sunday?'

Outside we have been making patterns with shapes and 'shape rolling' down guttering and pipes.
