Challenge Monday.

We have a small wild area at the back of the school field which is great for investigating the natural world and how it changes throughout the year. In Nursery we call this area our forest area and we usually try to go there every Monday.

This Monday we read the story of The Leaf Man by Lois Ehlert then we put on our wet suits and wellies and headed up to our forest to find the prettiest fallen leaves we could find so that we could make our own Leaf man pictures.

Once again the children listened brilliantly while we explained how we can stay safe in this area including always walking, never running, so we don't trip in the longer grass and always looking with our eyes first before we pick anything up to make sure we know what we are touching.

Last week we looked carefully at zero and this week we have been looking at the number one. We have learned rhymes to help us recognise and write them for those children who are ready.
