The children have been coming into Nursery beautifully this week and settling quickly on the carpet (A big thank you the parent/carers for your help with this) consequently we have been able to introduce a little more routine to the beginning of the session. We start with the register and say good morning/good afternoon to each other. We sing our special 'hello song' and we've been learning to sing it in French and Spanish too! Next we chant and clap to our days of the week song, then we discuss which day it is and what the weather is like.

We're off to the Moon! This week the children have discovered they each have a very special little rocket with a photograph of themselves in the window. In Nursery our aim is to nurture an environment which is positive, loving and caring so every time we notice the children being kind, using kind words, being helpful or taking care of our toys we celebrate this by moving their rocket onto the next star. Their rockets move along the stars with their lovely behaviour until they land on the moon. When a child lands on the moon we ring a little bell and everyone in Nursery stops what they are doing to hear who has landed on the moon. We all celebrate the child on the moon with lots clapping and hugging. We tell them how proud we are and they get a certificate to take home so they can celebrate with their family too.
