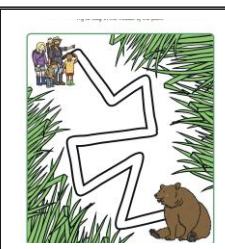

Maths - Bears have 4 paws. Can you draw a picture of 2 bears? How many paws do they have altogether?



Brown bears like to catch fish to eat. If a brown bear caught 4 fish and then, he caught 1 more, how many fish has he caught altogether? Draw a picture of the bear with the fish to help you find the answer.



Listen to Mrs Mason reading *We're Going on a Bear Hunt* then think of some different sounds the family might make on the bear hunt. What sounds would they make if they went through a thunder storm, along a beach or through a tunnel?

Some bears sleep in caves during the winter. Do you think you could build a cave? Ask a grown-up if you can use some chairs and cover them with sheets and blankets to create your own little cave. Now you can pretend to be a bear. Pretend to sleep in your cave and then when you get hungry you need to go and find some food.

Can you walk on your hands and feet like a bear? Can you walk like this whilst you move around, over and under obstacles? Sometimes bears can stand up on their back legs and make themselves really tall. Can you do this? How tall can you make yourself?
