  - And for those children who enjoy telling stories we have included the characters from Cinderella in the form of puppets.








The new year also brings and exciting opportunity for Reception children.

It's 'time' for clubs!


Those available this term are:

Ianguage through rhyme, song and story. We are very proud of being an inclusive school and this is an excellent chance to celebrate diversity and equip children to communicate in the future with a variety of individuals.

Clubs will run on Wednesdays starting on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> of January and will run for 4 weeks up to half term (BLOCK 1). They will start again after halfterm 26<sup>th</sup> February for another 4 week block (BLOCK 2). Your child can sign up

for Lego **OR** Sing, Rhyme and Sign and will then be allocated a space in Block 1 **OR** Block 2 (to ensure all 60 children have the same opportunity during the term) Clubs last from 3.15-4.15 prompt and children will need to be collected from the main entrance where you will be invited into the hall to safely pass your child on to you.

Look out for new reading material coming to you. Don't forget to use the speed words to ensure children can read the words by sight **before** you begin to read the story. In addition this term we are encouraging sounding out in **your head** rather than out loud.
