Can you find your shadow? Can you make your shadow grow? Can you make your shadow shrink? You may need to go outside if it's sunny or use a torch/ lamp inside. Could you make a shadow puppet?</p> <p>Play some relaxing music and colour in one of the 'mindful colouring' eggs.</p> <p>Paint your eggs from this lunchtime and let them dry. Once they have dried, put your science hat on and have fun rolling them. Which one goes the furthest? Make a slope and see what happens? Test different surfaces.</p> <p>Get up and active with a warm-up of stretches, star jumps and jogging on the spot.
